Brief Description

Dr. Shin-E Wang was graduated from National Yang Ming University in 2002, and completed her surgical residency at Taipei Veterans General Hospital from 2002 to 2007. She is currently working as an associate professor, Chief of minimally Invasive Surgery and attending surgeon in the division of General Surgery, Taipei Veterans General Hospital and National Yang Ming University. Her major interests include minimal invasive surgery including robotic and laparoscopic surgery, pancreas surgery and pancreas transplant. Her pancreas team is very actively involved in minimal invasive surgery, especially robotic Whipple operation (more than 500 RPD cases) and pancreas transplant (more than 170 cases). She was the experts committee member in International Evidence-Based Guidelines for Minimally Invasive Pancreatic Resection 2019 (IG-MIPR 2019), held at Miami. Her current academic and hospital appointments including associate professor of Surgery, National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University and chief of minimally Invasive Surgery and attending surgeon, Division of General Surgery, Taipei Veterans General Hospital since year 2009. Despite many of the awards in her excellent teaching for medical students both in National Yang Ming Chia Tung University and Taipei Veterans General Hospital, she also won several awards (2015-2021) in excellent video presentation of Taiwan Robotic Surgery Association. Her pancreas team had the honor of receiving two prestigious Copper Awards representing Taiwan's Symbol of National Quality(SNQ). This award also represent a Safety and Quality control of the medical environment in Taiwan. In 2017, they received the Copper Award for the Pancreas Transplant in and in 2019 again they received the Copper Award for Minimally Invasive Robotic Pancreatic Surgery-Small Wound for Major Pancreatic Surgery.
