Physicians and other health care professionals will be required to pay a processing fee to the AMA.

Kyoto offers a variety of transportation options to help visitors navigate the city efficiently. Public buses provide an extensive network that covers major attractions, and day passes are available. The subway system, consisting of the Karasuma Line and Tozai Line, connects key areas and tourist spots, making it easy to get around. Trains, including JR lines and private railways like Hankyu and Keihan, are convenient for traveling to nearby cities and regions. Taxis are widely available and suitable for short distances and direct routes. Additionally, many attractions are within walking distance, allowing visitors to enjoy the scenic streets and historical sites on foot.

Climate and Clothing

The temperature in Kyoto in September is both hot and humid with the average temperature high at 33°C and low at 25°C. Take proper measures to prevent heatstroke by choosing proper clothes or bringing items such as a parasol or hat.

In indoor facilities, the air conditioner may be highly effective, so we recommend bringing a layer of clothing even though it is hot and humid outside.



Local Time

Japan is 9 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +9).

Japan does not adopt the practice of Daylight-Saving Time or Summer Time.



Currency

The official currency of Japan is the yen.

You can exchange money at airports, major banks, currency exchange outlets in the city or at large hotels and department stores. Business Center of ICC Kyoto also offers currency exchange from major currency to Japanese yen for the convenience of conference visitors.

Most hotels, major department stores and restaurants accept credit cards such as VISA, Master, JCB, Amex and Diners.



Tax

A 10% consumption tax is included in all purchases except for products subject to a reduced tax rate. For international visitors, duty-free shopping is available at major department stores and shopping malls.



Mobile Phones

You can use your mobile phone in Japan with global roaming. Renting or purchasing SIM cards is also available at the major airports.
