

PACIFICO Yokohama

PACIFICO Yokohama, which is located in the waterfront area of the Minato Mirai 21 district, a new town in Yokohama, is one of the largest convention complexes in the world.

As one of the world's largest convention complexes, PACIFICO Yokohama is designed to include all necessary functions to organize meetings, conventions, exhibitions, and events, such as theater style halls, conference rooms, exhibition halls and a hotel. The building, whose exterior is beautiful and unique, has become one of the landmarks in Yokohama.

At PACIFICO Yokohama, about 1,000 events take place and more than four million people come to visit annually.

Especially in terms of international conferences, it is one of the most popular convention venues in Japan.

According to the statistics on international conferences in

2014 published by Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO), PACIFICO Yokohama ranks top for the number of international conferences held, attendees, and overseas visitors.





DISCOVER YOKOHAMA

Yamashita Park Yokohama Marine Tower

Yamashita Park is a beautiful seaside park in Yokohama, located along the waterfront near the Port of Yokohama. It offers scenic views of the bay, open green spaces, and famous landmarks such as the Hikawa Maru ship and the Marine Tower. It's a relaxing spot for walking, sightseeing, and enjoying the sea breeze.



Osanbashi Hall (Yokohama International Passenger Terminal)

Osanbashi Hall is a modern event space located within the Yokohama International Passenger Terminal. Sankeien Garden

Yokohama Air Cabin

Offering a unique perspective of the city's skyline and waterfront, this innovative mode of transport combines convenience with panoramic views, making it a memorable experience for visitors to Yokohama.
